Jeopardy Labs was created by Matt Johnson, a WSU student, with the goal of creating an easy to use Jeopardy template without PowerPoint. You can create a custom Jeopardy game in half an hour that can be played online or downloaded to your computer or flashdrive. You will be given a URL for your game so students can access the game from home. If you don't want to create a game yourself, you can browse through templates created by others and play games on a vast number of topics, although you'll want to review the content before playing the game with students. A dropdown menu allows a choice of 1-12 teams, with a manual score tracker at the bottom of the screen. This is a fun way to review classroom procedures and content, and works for all grade levels. Older students could create their own game at the end of a social studies or science unit. I have played the game whole class using one computer and projector with each table working as a team, and with small groups using one laptop per table with individual student players. Jeopardy Labs is free and does not require registration or login. If you would like the ability to organize the templates you create, privacy control, and delete control, Matt offers a \$20 lifetime membership.
